New Life-Saving Equipment for Newent



As mentioned above, the town now has another defibrillator to add to those that are already available in Newent. The new defibrillator is situated on the Library wall, and like the others, is available for any emergency need, 24 hours a day. Others are situated at:

- the outside wall of Two Rivers' offices in Cleeve Mill Lane

- courtyard - St Bartholemew's, Church St.
- front entrance, large Co-op, Market Square.
- outside Glebe Chapel next to the King's Arms, Ross Rd.

By arrangement, and by kind permission, there are also defibrillators available inside Sheppard House and MKM Builders' Supplies, but only when the premises are open.
