For those readers who are new to the **Neighbourhood Development Plan for Newent**, here in a nutshell is what the plan is all about:

The best chance for local people to have their say on what sort of development happens in their area is to make a Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP). This goes into more detail than the District-wide plan made by The Forest of Dean District Council, our Local Planning Authority, and is based on evidence collected from local surveys and other data such as produced by the most recent census

Our NDP started in 2018. Plans for small market towns like Newent, will usually take about five years to make. Ours has been held up by the pandemic amongst other thing, but changes are in the air and the NDP is gathering pace.

Our newly appointed Planning Consultant, Lee Searles, has already given us much useful advice and support, and his ongoing involvement has meant that we no longer expect to need the services of GRCC advisors who have guided us through the process so far.

Members of the NDP Steering Group recently attended a Zoom meeting with representatives for AECOM, the specialist infrastructure consultancy, which will be working with us to draw up a Design Code and conducting a Housing Needs Assessment (a data-driven analysis). They have also been

asked to produce a **Master Plan** for Newent. This work is funded by government grants.

There is, of course, much to be done before we hold another full public consultation on a draft Neighbourhood Development

Plan. Some of the evidence originally collected is now out of date due to recent housebuilding and development proposals in Newent, the loss of a major employer, changing social habits since the pandemic, and new government initiatives. Steering Group members will be working on updating information via desktop research as well as seeking the views of stakeholders and the general public. Look out for a forthcoming survey on Leisure and the Canal. Our survey on Housing remains open, so do please look at our dedicated website for access to the online form:

www.newentourfuture.do.uk. Our Business Survey will be re-launched very soon.

Our regular **Steering Group meetings** continue on the third Wednesday of each month. Please contact us if you think you can offer your expertise or skills. There are lots of different tasks ranging from talking to people, analysing surveys, organising events, graphic design. Just remember that our NDP must be in general conformity with the FoDDC Local Plan which has Newent as one of the focuses of development. We want to be able to influence the way development happens to the benefit all who live, work and study here. Having a completed NDP gives the district planners and the councillors who decide on planning applications the statutory legal basis on which to take our views into account.
